



# 2012 Young Artists Competition

## at the CHICAGO SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA

### OFFICIAL RULES

No purchase necessary to enter or win. Applications for the competition will be accepted beginning Wednesday, November 9, 2011, and ending Friday, January 20, 2012.

#### 1. ELIGIBILITY

The competition is open to full-time students in good standing in grades 9–12 attending any public, private, parochial, home or community music school in Chicago, Illinois. Entrants must be legal U.S. residents or in the process of obtaining citizenship and must be between 13 and 19 years of age as of November 9, 2011. Entrants must be instrumentalists and/or vocalists performing music of any genre. Employees, officers, board members, and independent contractors (and their immediate families (parent, child, spouse, or sibling and their respective spouses, regardless of where they reside) and those living in their same households, whether or not related) of FMR LLC (a/k/a Fidelity Investments) ("Sponsor"); Chicago Symphony Orchestra Association ("CSO"); and their respective parent companies, affiliates, subsidiaries, and advertising and promotion agencies are not eligible to participate in this competition. This competition is void where prohibited or restricted by law and is subject to all applicable federal, state and local laws and regulations.

By entering this competition, an entrant (and, if a minor, his or her parents or legal guardians) agrees to be bound by these Official Rules and the decisions of the judges and/or Sponsor, which are binding and final on all matters relating to this competition.

#### 2. HOW TO ENTER

To enter, submit a completed application form, together with an audio-video copy of your performance act in DVD, VHS, mini DVD or mini DV format (no other formats will be accepted) to Chicago Symphony Orchestra, attention: Ingrid Burrichter, YAC at the Chicago Symphony Orchestra, 220 South Michigan Avenue, Chicago, IL 60604. Applications may be submitted by mail or delivered in person.

**ALL ENTRIES MUST BE RECEIVED BY 5:00 PM (CT) ON FRIDAY, JANUARY 20, 2012.** Sponsor, CSO and judges are not responsible for late, lost, damaged, postage-due, incorrect, or misdirected entries.

Each performance act must be either a solo performance or a group performance consisting of no more than five (5) performers. If an entry involves a group performance, each performer must meet the eligibility requirements for this competition and for the purposes of this competition, each performer will be considered to be an "entrant" and the group performance will be considered to be a single entry. There is a limit of one (1) entry per student (whether as a solo performer or as part of a group). If more than one entry is received from, or involves, the same student, only the first entry received from, or that involves, that student will be judged and the other entries will be disqualified. Illegible, incomplete or altered entry forms, as well as any entries that Sponsor or either of the CSO discovers to be false or fraudulent, will be disqualified.

Performance acts must be instrumental or vocal musical performances of any genre. Each performance act must not be longer than five (5) minutes in duration. Performance acts that involve lip-synching, miming or other mimicking of a vocal or instrumental performance will be disqualified.

Performance acts must be in keeping with the Sponsor's and CSO's respective images, and may not be offensive or inappropriate, as determined by the Sponsor and CSO in their sole discretion. Sponsor and CSO reserve the right to disqualify an entry if they determine, in their sole discretion, the entry to be offensive, inappropriate, not in keeping with their image or otherwise not in

compliance with these Official Rules. Copies of the performance acts that are submitted by entrants in this competition shall become the exclusive property of the Sponsor and will not be returned. By submitting an application, the entrant (and, if minor, his or her parents or legal guardians) grants to the Sponsor and CSO an irrevocable, worldwide, fully paid, royalty-free license to copy, edit, modify, display, publish, perform and otherwise exploit in any manner the audition performance (in whole or in part) as well as all subsequent elements associated with the competition, including but not limited to the live audition, rehearsal process and/or live performance in all media now known or hereafter discovered, without further approval of or payment to the entrant and/or parent or legal guardian. Entrants will not receive any monetary compensation at any stage of this competition, including but not limited to any live audition, rehearsal or on-stage performance (other than the Grand Prizes that are awarded to the Grand Prize Winner).

Each entrant is required to identify on the application form an adult person who will act as the entrant's mentor ("Mentor") for the competition. The Mentor must be a teacher (of music or any other subject) or administrator at the entrant's high school, a private music instructor, or an administrator or staff member of a local community, music or arts organization. The Mentor must sign the entrant's application form and provide his or her contact information (telephone number and email address), school or music/arts organization affiliation and relationship to the entrant.

### **3. SELECTION OF WINNERS**

All eligible entries received by Sponsor will be judged by a panel of expert judges. There will be two (2) judging rounds. In the first round, the performance act submitted with each eligible entry will be judged to determine the top twenty (20) submissions, each of which shall be considered to be a "Finalist Act." For purposes of these Rules, each member of a Finalist Act shall be considered to be a "Finalist."

In the final round, each of the Finalist Acts will have the opportunity to perform a live audition in Orchestra Hall at Symphony Center (located at 220 S. Michigan Avenue in Chicago, IL) on Sunday, February 12, 2012, and the live auditions will be judged by a second panel of expert judges to determine each Finalist Act's audition score. The four (4) Finalist Acts with the highest audition score will each be a winning act. At the Sponsor's discretion, the act with the fifth highest audition score may also be selected as a winning act, or if fewer than four (4) Finalist Acts meet or exceed a minimum audition score established by Sponsor, the CSO and/or the judges, Sponsor may elect to select as winning acts only those Finalist Acts whose audition score met or exceeded the minimum audition score, thereby resulting in fewer than four (4) winning acts being selected. Each Finalist that is part of a winning act will be a Grand Prize Winner.

Each round of judging will utilize a one hundred (100) point scoring system to grade each performance based on the following criteria (each element having the potential maximum point value listed): (i) technique (25 points), (ii) technical accuracy in the performance of the selected musical piece (25 points), (iii) interpretation of the selected musical piece (25 points), and (iv) presentation (25 points). In the event of a tie, the performance with the highest score for presentation will prevail. In the event of a further tie in such score, the tie will be broken in such manner not involving chance as the judges may determine in their sole discretion.

All decisions of Sponsor, the CSO and the judges are final and binding on all matters relating to this competition.

The first round of judging is expected to be completed by the week of January 23, 2012. Each Finalist will be notified by phone and will be required to sign (and if a Finalist is a minor, the Finalist's parents or legal guardian will also be required to sign) a Participation Agreement, an affidavit of eligibility, a liability release, and, where lawful, a publicity release and deliver such signed documents to Sponsor prior to the live audition on Sunday, February 12, 2012. See "Participation Agreement and Releases" below for additional information about these documents. If such documents are not returned to Sponsor by the date specified above, if a Finalist cannot be contacted at the telephone number specified on the entry form, or if a Finalist or Grand Prize Winner is not in compliance with these Official Rules, the prize(s) to be awarded to such entrant will be forfeited and, at Sponsor and CSO's discretion, an alternate Finalist or Grand Prize Winner may be selected by the judges. Sponsor reserves the right in its sole discretion to conduct a background check on entrants chosen as Finalists and disqualify any individual who has been charged or convicted of a crime or if Sponsor and/or CSO determine in their sole discretion that awarding a prize to such individual may reflect unfavorably on the competition or Sponsor and/or CSO.

NOTE: If a Finalist (including any entrant in a group performance that is selected as a Finalist Act) is not available to (1) participate in the live auditions at Symphony Center currently scheduled for Sunday, February 12, 2012, (2) participate and work with the professional musicians and coaches to rehearse their act on dates and at times set by Sponsor and CSO in their sole discretion between March 1, 2012, and June 20, 2012, at Symphony Center (or such other venue as may be substituted by Sponsor or the CSO), and (3) participate in the concert at Symphony Center scheduled for Wednesday, June 20, 2012, and the rehearsals for such concert, such Finalist and his or her Finalist Act will be disqualified and Sponsor may, but is not obligated to, select the entry with the next highest points from among all remaining entries as a replacement Finalist Act or Grand Prize Winner, as the case may be.

Sponsor and the CSO reserve the right, in their sole discretion, to change the dates associated with the judging activities or the concert or rehearsals that are part of the Grand Prize, or substitute another venue for the live auditions or for the concert or rehearsals that are part of the Grand Prize, due to circumstances outside of their control.

If any Grand Prize Winner is determined to be ineligible or declines the opportunity to participate (or is unable to participate) in Grand Prize activities, that Grand Prize Winner (and his or her Finalist Act) will be disqualified and Sponsor may, but is not obligated to, select the Finalist Act with the next-highest audition score from among all remaining Finalist Acts as a replacement Grand Prize Winner.

#### 4. PRIZES

Grand Prize—Each Grand Prize Winner will be awarded a Grand Prize consisting of (a) the opportunity for the Grand Prize Winner to perform on stage before a live audience at Symphony Center during the June 20, 2012 Chicago Symphony Orchestra concert (to be eligible to participate in the concert, the Grand Prize Winner must participate in the rehearsals with professional musicians described above); (b) the rehearsals with professional musicians and coaches described above in preparation for the June 20, 2012 live performance at Symphony Center; (c) six (6) tickets for the Grand Prize Winner's family and friends to attend the June 20, 2012 Chicago Symphony Orchestra concert at Symphony Center; (d) professional photos of rehearsal and performance on stage at the concert; and (e) a \$100 Visa Gift Card. Approximate retail value ("ARV") of each Grand Prize: \$515. In addition, the Mentor of each winning act will receive two (2) tickets for the Mentor and his or her guests to attend the June 20, 2012 Chicago Symphony Orchestra concert at Symphony Center. Approximate retail value ("ARV") of each prize awarded to Mentors: \$100. The Mentor and all guests of the Grand Prize Winner attending the June 20, 2012 Chicago Symphony Orchestra Concert may be required to complete and submit a publicity release prior to the event. All such guests who are minors, as well as the Grand Prize Winner if a minor, must be accompanied at the event by a parent or legal guardian.

First Prizes – Each of the entrants of an entry chosen as a Finalist Act, and each Mentor of a Finalist Act, will receive a T-shirt and a certificate of participation signed by Deborah Rutter. ARV of each First Prize: \$6.

Total ARV of all prizes: \$2,700. Actual total retail value of all prizes will vary based upon the number of students in the performance acts and the total number of Grand Prizes and First Prizes awarded.

All winners are solely responsible for any applicable taxes, expenses, and costs or fees associated with acceptance and/or use of prize including, without limitation, transportation to and from events, meals, gratuities, and the like. All winners, Mentors and their respective guests must comply with all Symphony Center rules and regulations. All prizes will be awarded, assuming sufficient number of eligible entries. Prizes are awarded "as is" with no warranty or guarantee, either express or implied, by Sponsor. Winners may not substitute, assign or transfer any prize or redeem any prize for cash, including concert tickets for the June 20, 2011, Chicago Symphony Orchestra concert at Symphony Center. Sponsor reserves the right, at its sole discretion, to substitute any prize (or portion thereof) with one of comparable or greater value.

Winners (or, if minors, their parents or legal guardians) are responsible for all applicable federal, state and local taxes, if any, as well as any other costs and expenses associated with prize acceptance and use not specified herein as being provided. All prize details are at Sponsor's sole discretion. Each Finalist (or, if a minor, his or her parent or legal guardian) must provide Sponsor with his or her Social Security number or tax identification number and shall receive a federal tax reporting statement if necessary.

For the live performance during the Chicago Symphony Orchestra concert on June 20, 2012, a winning Finalist Act may be asked to perform an alternative music selection in their current repertoire chosen by the Chicago Symphony Orchestra that is different than the music selection performed in their application and/or live audition. If a winning Finalist Act does not agree to perform an alternative music selection, the prize(s) to be awarded to such Grand Prize Winners will be forfeited and, at Sponsor and CSO's discretion, an alternate Grand Prize Winner may be selected by the judges. Sponsor and/or the CSO (or, if requested by Sponsor, the judges) will determine the order in which the Grand Prize Winners will perform during the June 20, 2012, concert. Sponsor and the CSO shall have the right to approve the wardrobe of the Grand Prize Winners for the June 20, 2012, concert.

If for any reason, including but not limited to labor dispute, war, weather, acts of God or any other cause beyond their reasonable control, the live performance scheduled for June 20, 2012, is cancelled, Sponsor and CSO shall have no obligation to reschedule such performance or provide the opportunity for the Grand Prize Winners to perform at an alternative live performance, and shall have no further obligation to the Grand Prize Winners, their Mentors or any other person with respect to that portion (and all related portions) of the Grand Prize or otherwise with respect to such cancellation.

#### 5. PARTICIPATION AGREEMENT AND RELEASES

As described in Section 3 above, each Finalist (and, if the Finalist is a minor, the Finalist's parent or legal guardian) will be required to sign and return a Participation Agreement and the releases described in Section 3 above within the time period specified in that section. Pursuant to those documents, the Finalist will, among other things, (a) agree to comply with certain rules and procedures applicable while participating in the audition process and, if chosen as a Grand Prize Winner, the concert and other events associated with the Grand Prize, (b) acknowledge that neither the Sponsor nor CSO is obligated to have the Finalist or any student performers appear in any concerts, and that Sponsor or CSO may disqualify the Finalist from the remainder of this competition at any time and for any reason, in their sole discretion, and (c) grant the Sponsor and the CSO the right to photograph, film, and record the audition process, rehearsals and the concert and other events associated with this competition, including the Grand Prize and the perpetual right to use such materials for their respective publicity, advertising and other purposes without further approval of or compensation to the Finalist or the Finalist's parents or legal guardian.

## 6. GENERAL CONDITIONS

Entrants must follow all the rules, direction, and instructions of the Sponsor and the managers of this competition. Rules and procedures are subject to change at the Sponsor and CSO's sole discretion. Entrants (and, if minors, their parents or legal guardians), by participating, agree that Sponsor; Chicago Symphony Orchestra Association; and their respective parent companies, affiliates, subsidiaries, and advertising and promotion agencies and all their respective officers, directors, employees, board members, representatives and agents (collectively, "Released Parties") will have no liability whatsoever for, and shall be held harmless by entrants against, any liability for any injuries, losses or damages of any kind, including death, to persons or property resulting in whole or in part, directly or indirectly, from acceptance, possession, misuse or use of any prize or participation in this competition or any of the events awarded as prizes. Except where legally prohibited, entry into this competition and/or an entrant's acceptance of any prize constitutes permission for Sponsor and CSO and their designees to use his or her name, address (city and state), photograph, voice, and/or other likeness and prize information for advertising, trade and promotional purposes without further compensation, in all media now known or hereafter discovered, worldwide in perpetuity, without notice or review or approval. If any entry or any aspect of the contest is, in Sponsor's sole opinion, compromised by virus, worms, bugs, unauthorized human intervention or other causes that, in the sole opinion of Sponsor, corrupt or impair the administration, security, fairness or proper play of this competition or the submission of entries, or if for any other reason this competition is not capable of running as planned (including without limitation, technical failures or any other causes which corrupt or affect the administration, security, fairness, integrity or proper conduct of this contest), Sponsor reserves the right at its sole discretion to cancel, suspend, modify or terminate this contest and proceed in a manner it deems fair and reasonable, which may include, at its discretion, selecting the winners from all eligible non-suspect entries received prior to such cancellation, modification or termination.
